They will create a sense of urgency while talking with you or pretend they are just updating records, maybe say you have been a victim of identity theft, or we have an arrest warrant for you. They all are after one thing. Your money and they do so by stealing your identity and they do that by conning you into giving your personal information to them such as your social security number, name and date of birth, bank account numbers, credit card numbers and so on. It's really despicable. And when I get these calls I sometimes wonder if you are getting these calls too. Please never give out any of this information. Law enforcement almost never makes arrests in these cases because the conmen use electronic money transfers to offshore accounts. Bottom line, if it sounds too good to be true, it is. if you feel pressured hang up, and if they claim to be law enforcement, hang up and call the sheriffs office. We're all in this together!
